










Montessori Curriculum Areas Overview







The core curriculum of Montessori education is centered around child-led learning and includes several key areas of focus. These areas are typically divided into the following subjects.



- Practical Life
- Sensorial
- Language
- Mathematics
- Cultural
- Art and Music

Additional to core areas we have in Montessori education emphasises values such as respect, cooperation, and social development. The flexible and individualised nature of the curriculum allows children to progress at their own pace, fostering a love for learning.

Practical Life

Activities that help children develop daily living skills, such as pouring, cleaning, and caring for the environment. These tasks promote motor skills, develop independence, and responsibility, coordination and self-discipline.

Examples:

- Pouring and transferring: Using materials like beans or water to practice pouring between containers, enhancing fine motor skills.
- Buttoning and Zipping: Activities involving dressing frames to teach self-care and clothing management.
- Cleaning and Care of Environment: Tasks such as sweeping, dusting, or washing tables, which build responsibility and respect for the learning environment.











Sensorial



Sensorial education involves Materials and activities that refine the senses (sight, sound, touch, taste, and smell). This area helps children classify and understand the world around them through sensory experiences.

Examples:


- Sound Boxes: Containers filled with materials that create different sounds, helping children develop auditory discrimination.
- Colour Tablets: Exercises that involve matching and grading colours to enhance visual perception.
- Scented Bottles: Identifying various scents strengthens olfactory senses and encourages vocabulary related to descriptions.

Language

Description:



Language development is critical in Montessori education, focusing on phonetic awareness and literacy skills. Activities encourage communication, vocabulary expansion, and writing readiness. Development of reading and writing skills through phonics, vocabulary, grammar, and storytelling.

Examples:

- Sandpaper Letters: Children trace letters while saying their sounds, blending tactile learning with auditory recognition.
- Storytelling and Reading: Introduce books that captivate children's interests, promoting comprehension and fluency.
- Word Building with Moveable Alphabet: Allows children to experiment with spelling and constructing words, fostering literacy in a handson way.







Mathematics

Description:

Montessori mathematics provides concrete materials to introduce abstract concepts, encouraging problem-solving and logical thinking. Children explore numbers, operations, and mathematical relationships through hands-on activities.












Mathematics





- Number Rods: Use these visual aids to introduce counting, addition, and subtraction in a tangible manner.
- Golden Beads: Materials representing units, tens, hundreds, and thousands to explore the decimal system.
- Patterning Activities: Utilize beads and counters to teach patterns, sequences, and early problem-solving skills.







Cultural

Description:

The cultural area encompasses geography, science, history, and the arts, promoting a sense of global awareness and appreciation of diversity.












Cultural

Examples:

 World Maps and Flags: Introduce children to various countries, cultures, and their customs through interactive materials.

 Nature Studies: Engaging in outdoor activities like gardening or nature walks fosters observation skills and a connection to science.

 Art Projects: Encourage creativity through various art forms, exposing children to famous artists and different cultures' art styles.




